Avon Old Farms School

A BRIEF HISTORY











Avon Old Farms School was founded by Theodate Pope Riddle, Connecticut's first licensed female architect. Theodate's imaginitive genius as an architect and her vision and determination to create a school for boys, combined with her personal wealth, made possible the founding of the school in 1927. The original stone and oak architecture is modeled after structures found in the English Cotswolds, and was built by craftsmen in the Cotswold and Tudor styles using traditional English methods with materials hewn from the school's property. The school sits upon 1,000 acres of rolling woodland, with the Farmington River to the east and picturesque Beaver Pond laying just a short walk south of the core campus. The center of campus includes a beautiful vista overlooking the Farmington Valley.

In the founding years, Avon tried to combine the best of English traditions with a daring and radical modern curriculum. This provided for difficulties in attracting students, though the school found many successes along with the challenges. The school was forced to close during World War II, when it became a convalescent hospital for blinded Army veterans, but it re-opened in 1948; however, with no money, no endowment, no students, and no faculty, the institution faced major obstacles.

Through the leadership of headmasters of Don Pierport, George Trautman, and Ken LaRocque, in addition to that of countless board members, alumni, parents, and friends of the school, Avon Old Farms stands strong today. The school has grown from 48 boys at its opening in 1927 to a full capacity of 400 boys in grades 9-12 and postgraduates. The campus offers outstanding facilities, including a new student center and athletic field house as well as an NHL-quality arena. The Ordway Science and Technology Center was completed in 2002, and the new Beatson Performing Arts Center opened in March of 2007.

As Peter Aron '65, then Board Chairman, wrote in 2002 on the occasion of the school's 75th anniversary, "We have filled and overflowed Mrs. Riddle's original buildings, and have continued to build. By any measure, we are very different today — academically, athletically, socially — as a reflection of a very different society. Yet certainly Mrs. Riddle would recognize her school, and I like to think that she would recognize her boys. The young men of Avon are recognizable, not just by the winged beaver on their blazers, but by their direct and friendly gaze."

Directors

Dr. Edward Bolkovac, Choir Director

Prior to taking up the position of Primrose Fuller Professor of Choral Music at the Hartt School in the fall of 1999 and leadership of its Vocal Studies Division in 2001, Edward Bolkovac was Senior Lecturer in Music and Director of Choral Activities at the University of Queensland in Brisbane, Australia. He became known throughout Australia for his performances of Baroque oratorios, artistic leadership of the Brisbane Early Music Festival and his many international workshops. For many years Bolkovac was the Artistic Director of the California Bach Society, one of the San Francisco area's premiere performance organizations. In addition, he was director of the internationally recognized Kodaly Music Education Program at Holy Names College in Oakland, CA where he also directed the college choral ensembles and chamber orchestra. Recent performances of major works at the Hartt School and the New Haven Chorale have included Bach's Magnificat, Bernstein's Chichester Psalms, Te Deum by Berlioz, Bloch's Sacred Service, Brahms' Schicksalslied, Copland's Appalachian Spring and Tenderland (Rivera concert version), Haydn's Creation, Verdi's Requiem, Mozart's Requiem and Coronation Mass and A Sea Symphony by Ralph Vaughan Williams. He has led choir tours to Austria, the Czech Republic, Germany, and Hungary. He is also active as an international choral clinician and conductor, having traveled frequently to Australia, England, New Zealand, Taiwan and the Philippines. In March of 2003 he was appointed as the artistic director of the New Haven Chorale. In May 2008 he will be a guest conductor for the New Haven Symphony in performances of Mozart's Symphony in D Major (Paris) and Ein deutsches Requiem by Brahms. He studied conducting in Hungary and completed his doctorate at Stanford University.

David Chrzanowski, Choir Accompanist

David Chrzanowski has worked as Chapel Organist and Choral Accompanist at Westminster School (Simsbury, CT) since 2001. Mr. Chrzanowski received a Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance degree from Bucknell University, where he studied with Dr. William Payn. He went on to receive a Masters of Music degree in Organ Performance from the Yale University School of Music, where he studied with Thomas Murray, Charles Krigbaum, and Gerre Hancock. After graduating from Yale in 1995, Mr. Chrzanowski became the Director of Music of St. Rita Church in Hamden, Connecticut, a position he held for ten years. Mr. Chrzanowski has served as dean of the New Haven, CT Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and was Music/Worship Repertoire and Standards Chair on the executive board of the CT American Choral Directors Association. An active accompanist, Mr. Chrzanowski played for the 2003-2008 CT CMEA Northern Region Music Festivals, the 2005-2007 CT Independent School Music Festivals, the 2007 NCCC Music Festival and the Connecticut Shoreline Arts Festival. Mr. Chrzanowski is also a music teacher and accompanist for the Ensign Darling Vocal Fellowship Program.

Directors

Petko Dimitrov, Orchestra Director

Petko Dimitrov is the Music Director of the Ridgefield Symphony Youth Orchestra and Assistant Conductor of the Ridgefield Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Dimitrov also serves as Assistant Conductor of the Haddonfield Symphony and Principle Guest Conductor of the New Symphony Orchestra in Sofia, Bulgaria. In 2007, the Bruno Walter Memorial Foundation awarded Petko its prestigious emerging conductor award.

Petko was born in 1973. He took his first music lessons at the age of seventeen from his grandfather, a choral conductor, arranger, and composer. He graduated the State Academy of Music in 2000 with a Bachelor Degree in Music Pedagogy. In his native Bulgaria he also studied orchestra conducting with Ivan Bakalov, Vassil Kazandjiev, and Rossen Milanov. Petko made his debut as a conductor with the New Symphony Orchestra, Sofia, Bulgaria, in May 1998, performing a concert with music by Sir Michael Tippet and Henry Purcell, in collaboration with The British Council. Since then he has been an assistant Conductor of the Orchestra and has performed subscription concerts and commissions regularly. He has also been active as a Conductor of a Chamber Ensemble of The New Symphony Orchestra.

Since 2001 Petko Dimitrov has been studying and working in the United States. In 2004 he completed his Master Degree in Orchestra Conducting at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, under the direction of Prof. Kenneth Kiesler. During his time in Ann Arbor, Michigan, he performed concerts with the University of Michigan Symphony Orchestra, Campus Philharmonia Orchestra, and Campus Symphony Orchestra. Recently, Petko completed his studies with Prof. Gustav Meier at the Peabody Conservatory, John Hopkins University in Baltimore, MD, where he pursued a Graduate Performance Diploma in Orchestral Conducting. As an assistant conductor of the Peabody Symphony Orchestra Mr. Dimitrov took over a performance of Stravinsky's The Rite of Spring with only three days notice.

Dr. David Hebert, Band Director

Dr. David G. Hebert is an Assistant Professor with the Boston University School of Music. An instrumental music educator and ethnomusicologist, he has taught music for Seattle Public Schools, as well as internationally for Moscow State University, Tokyo Gakugei University, and Te Wananga O Aotearoa. Dr. Hebert's cross-cultural research interests include creativity, transculturaltion, competition, and policy in music education. He has been awarded grants from the Simpson Humanities Center, National Band Association, Japan Ministry of Education, Arts Council of New Zealand, and United States Department of Education. Dr. Hebert contributed lesson plans to the Silver Burdett Making Music school textbook series and has published music research in ten different peer-reviewed scholarly journals. His PhD dissertation, under Patricia Shehan Campbell at University of Washington, was the first study to identify the world's largest music competition and to describe the experience of its contestants: adolescent musicians in Japanese wind bands. It provided material for forthcoming books in Japanese and English. Other recent projects include the first studies of Maori brass bands (in press) and New Zealand Tongan brass bands (in revision), and the first international conference panel on patriotism in music education. Dr. Hebert serves on the Editorial Board of Research and Issues in Music Education and is Associate Editor of both International Journal of Education and the Arts and Research in New Zealand Performing Arts.
